- The domestic environmental movement has transformed since the 1960s, impacting the development of environmental policy in Canada.
- Settler-Colonial history and resource extraction go hand in hand in Canada.
- Our own eco-worldviews and the worldviews of others may differ, making it critical to unpack contrasting visions and objectives for the planet, people, and future generations.
- Within the landscape of Ecopolitics there is a relationship between Racism, Settler-Colonialism, Patriarchy, and Capitalism.

### Discussion Questions

1. Do you think the governance of environmentalism involves more of a cooperative or a competitive dynamic?
2. How do you think settler-colonialism influences environmental politics in Canada?
3. What is the role of technology in environmental politics? Does technology support sustainability efforts, or harm them?
4. How does your worldview inform the positions you take on eco-political issues? What is the role of epistemological and ontological assumptions in our worldviews?
